Assessment Reduced by Nearly \$400,000 This Year; Details of Values

The total net taxable land on which the city of Prince Rupert will this year strike its tax rate will amount to \$4.588,439 as compared with \$1,942.010.50 last year. The total assessment as brought down by the assessor and later reduced by the court of revision which closed its sessions yesterday is \$15,097,842.25 as compared with \$15,575,631 last year. G.T.P. Railway Co. assessment stands this year at \$2,343,-461 as against \$2,340,961 in 1923.

The total assessment as brought down by the assessor this year was \$15,237,531, this figure being reduced to that given above - \$15,097.842.25 - by the court of revision. The total net taxable land as set out by the assessor was \$4,619,295, this being reduced to \$4,558,439 by the court of revision.

### PURCHASE

Applications are received for pur chase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) and \$2,50 per acre. Further infor mation regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on imber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stumpage.


