BIG INCREASE GRAIN LOADING

Canadian National Railways Report Business Year Much Heavier Than Last

WINNIPEG, Man., July 12.—Nearly 225,000,000 bushels of wheat have been marketed over Canadian National lines since September 1, 1923, and loadings are still being made at the rate of over 2,000 cars weekly. This is the record of grain movement for July shown by the Canadian National grain loadings report issued last night. The report covering the period from July 4 to 10 inclusive shows 2,085 cars loaded in that period against 637 in same period last year. Total loadings since September 1 last have been 166,536 cars containing 221,445,000 bushels against totals of 124,034 cars and 163,969,000 bushels in same period last year, the increase being 42,502 cars and 60,476,000 bushels. Approximately fifty per cent of the grain loaded during the week came directly from the hands of the farmers, and there remain 2,371,000 bushels in storage in elevators on Canadian National western lines. Alberta with 1,370,000 bushels loaded and 501,000 bushels marketed led the loadings during the week, Saskatchewan points loading 1,237,000 bushels and marketing 744,000 bushels during the period. Alberta has 1,079,000 bushels in store and Saskatchewan 1,000,000 bushels on the company's line.

Of total inspections on all railways at Winnipeg during the past week Canadian National loads have been about sixty per cent. The flow of grain to Vancouver continues unabated, a total of 17,250 cars having been delivered there to July 10. The total for the entire grain year ending September 17, 1923, was 4,545.

The plane will have a cruising speed of 80 miles an hour and a full-out speed of 100 miles.

PREMIER MACDONALD'S SON HEADS DEBATING TEAM COMING CANADA

Subjects of International Importance Will be Discussed on Edmonton Platform

EDMONTON, July 12.—M. J. MacDonald, son of Premier J. Ramsay MacDonald, and his team of debaters from Oxford University will engage a picked team of University of Alberta students in a series of debates here next fall.

The actual date of the meeting has not yet been settled, but the debaters will arrive in Canada early in October, and after engaging in debates with several of the eastern colleges will make the trip through the West.

Other members of the party are J. D. Woodruff, of New College, and M. C. Hollis, of Balliol.

The list of subjects to come up for debate is as follows: Oxford will propose that the policy of France toward Germany since the war be condemned; that the principle of prohibition is wrong; that the extension of state interference with the individual is a chief evil of the times—Oxford arguing the negative.

Oxford will propose that the referendum is a necessary part of representative government.

Oxford will propose that in a democracy ministers should be directly responsible to a popularly elected assembly.

The Oxford party will arrive early in October and will immediately engage the colleges west of Buffalo, and will remain in America and Canada throughout November, December and January.

WHIPPED CREAM IS FAKED BY GERMANS

Last of Food Restrictions Imposed During War Has Been Removed

BERLIN, July 12.—The sale of whipping cream, outlawed early in 1914 as a war measure, is again permitted in Germany by government order.

This is the last of the food restrictions to be removed, and within a few days of the announcement every coffee house in Berlin was serving "whipped cream" in such amounts that the health authorities investigated and, it was stated, ascertained that substitute of white of egg, evaporated milk and other preparations was being used.

EDISON'S SON IS NOT SUCCESSFUL

His Inventions Not Acceptable Commercially and Companies Become Bankrupt

NEWARK, N.J., July 12.—Thomas A. Edison, attempting to follow in the footsteps of his father, has met with financial reverses which have resulted in a company formed to exploit two of his inventions going into the hands of receivers. Failure of the inventions to become commercial successes resulted in the Ecometer Manufacturing Company of Orange finding itself in the hands of a receiver. The company manufactured the ecometer, a gasoline saving device, and a period timer for Ford automobiles. The younger Edison, Beatrice M. Edison and E. D. Woodward were the incorporators. Liabilities are said to be \$31,648 and assets \$18,634 inclusive of a \$10,634 patent value. This amount of assets could not be realized by a forced sale, it was stated.
