No progress was made in the cure of the disease until the living germ, which was responsible for it was discovered in 1887, and some years afterwards, it was determined that the organism was carried from sick to healthy people by the local goats, which supplied all the milk. An examination of the blood of infected animals showed that the bacteria multiplied in the tissues of the goats, and that some of them were excreting the guilty organism in their milk.

"Thus the final link in the chain had been found. The miliary authorities struck milk out of the dietary, and replaced it by an imported variety, and from that day to this there has scarcely victim, man.
