

### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

#### PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres before a Crown Grant can be received.

#### PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stampage.

#### HOMESTEAD LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, site being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

#### LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

#### GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Fees on partly free permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.

HAKODATE, Japan.—A subterranean peninsula, as large as Korea, runs through the middle of the Sea of Japan, according to officers of the Japanese Navy's special service ship Yamato. This vessel has been making a survey of these waters, and recently put in here for supplies.

#### CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT.

**TAKE NOTICE THAT:** The Corporation of the City of Prince Rupert intends to construct a pavement fifteen feet wide, consisting of a mattress of timber over which will be placed a paving giving a depth of two inches stone and sand, on a portion of 9th Avenue commencing at a point eight feet east of the centre line intersection of McBride Street and 9th Avenue, thence along 9th Avenue as shown on plans and profiles, commencing at the point eight feet east of the centre line intersection of 8th and 9th Avenues, as a local improvement, and intends to specially assess the cost upon the land abutting directly on the work except such portion of the cost as is incurred at street intersections and at school property.

2. The estimated cost of the work is \$3,655.00, of which \$350.81 is to be paid by the Corporation, and the remainder amount to be assessed on the property, the amount being \$8,377.12. The special assessment is to be paid in 10 annual installments.

3. Persons desiring to petition against undertaking the work must do so on or before the 15th day of November, 1924.
