Forest fires occur in British Columbia from May until October and are most destructive in July and August.

There are three kinds of fires: surface, ground and crown. Surface fires as a rule travel rather dowly and are governed by wind emperature and humidity and feed mostly on dry wood and grasses. Ground fires travel very slowly and feed mostly on vegetation, mold, decayed wood and moss. Crown fires occur in thick resinous timber. They travel very rapidly feeding on the tops of the trees. They are the most dangerous fires. This kind of
