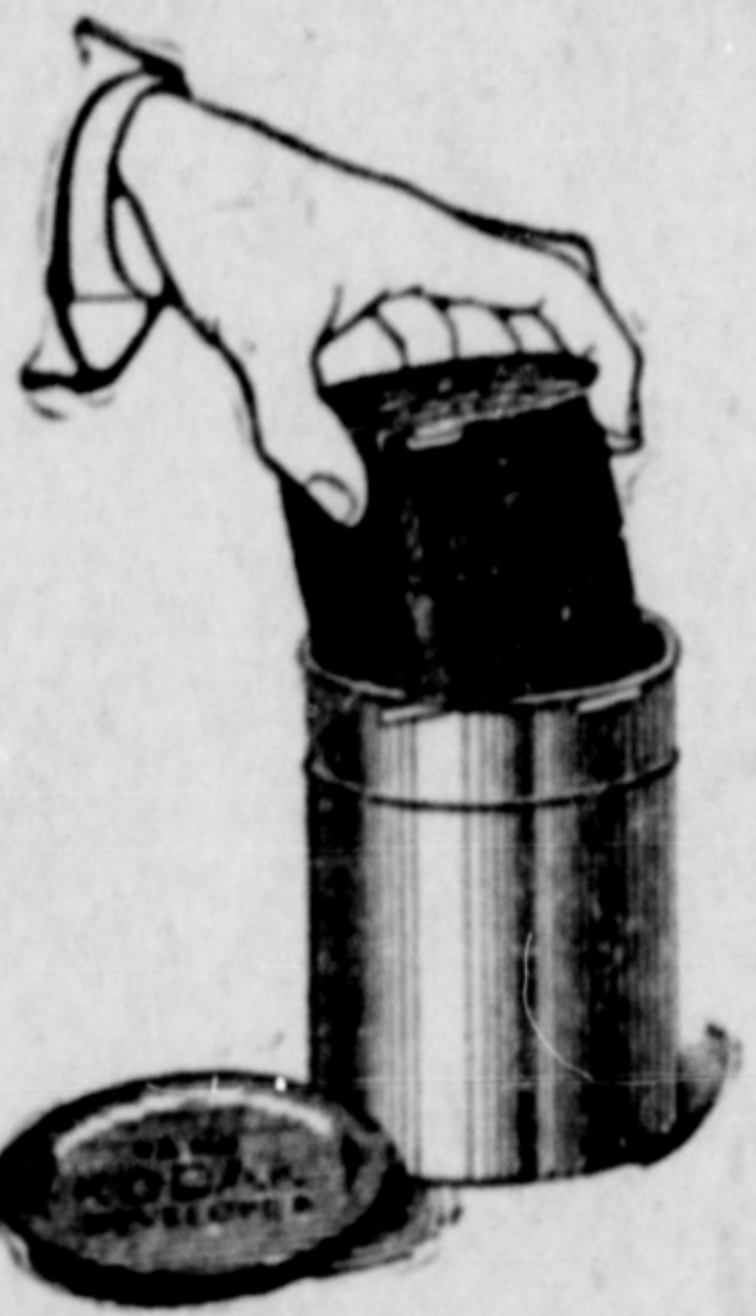

Los Angeles Lumber Products steamer El Abeto has arrived at Buckley Bay to load lumber for California.

The city council last night decided to call for tenders for the sale of lots 15, 16, 17 and 18, Block 29, section 7.

An offer to purchase a boiler shell from the city for \$30 was accepted by the city council at its meeting last night.

Five months of the license fee for the Dominion Club was ordered by the city council last night to be refunded to A. E. Henderson.

At the meeting of the city council last night four construction bylaws which have been before the council at various times were reconsidered and finally passed.

F. G. Dawson, director of the Canadian National Railways, arrived yesterday on the steamer Princess Mary and left on the train later for Smithers. He expects to return on Wednesday.

A letter received from the municipality of North Vancouver last night asking for the endorsement of a town planning scheme was referred by the city council to the Board of Works for report.

A contra offer was made by the city council last night to the Prince Rupert Club to remove the rock from their lot if the club deeded 24 feet of their property instead of 14 feet as originally planned.

An account for \$53.31 was ordered last night by the city council to be paid to the Kaizen Hardware Company and a claim against Nick Gruvich for \$158.12 for steel rails was ordered to be collected.

An offer to quarry Smith Island rock for the city at \$1.60 a yard was made to the city council last night by F. Eydolfson. It was to be hand size six inches by twelve. The matter was referred to the Board of Works for report.

S. J. McLeod, president of the Board of Trade has telegraphed a reply to the wire received yesterday from Fred Stork at Ottawa acknowledging the telegram and asking if there is any assistance that can be given here in connection with the elevator campaign.

G.G.M.M. steamer Canadian Volunteer, Capt. John McKernan, arrived in port at 4.30 yesterday afternoon and, after loading 500 tons of Duthie ore for Selby, California, sailed at 6 this morning for Ocean Falls where she will complete cargo with paper before proceeding to California.

At the city council meeting last night it was decided to purchase a Day Elder truck at a cost of \$5,030. There was a good deal of argument as to the relative merits of the Day Elder and the Federal but the one purchased was slightly cheaper than the other and one now in the service of the city was said to be doing the work well.

At the city council meeting last night a report was read from Dr. Cade in which the suggestion was made that the keeping of goats in the city should be controlled. The city solicitor said the city had no legal power to do this but they could prohibit. The matter which had previously been referred to the health officer by the council was now referred to the Board of Works for further consideration.
