BALL GROUND MCBRIDE ST.

Proposal to Utilize Square at Corner of Sixth St. Laid Before Council

Last night a delegation from the schoolboard waited on the city council and asked them to consider the proposal to convert the square at the corner of McBride and Sixth Street into a ball ground for the use of the young people of the city, utilizing the four rectangular plots at the junction of the streets and diverting the road to the outside of the ground. The matter was referred to the Board of Works for further consideration.

Trustee Parker outlined the proposal at the meeting of the council last night. He said the four little squares put together would make a good sized playground and this would be a good time to take up the matter of improving them. The road would be diverted, making a detour of half a block. He was sure this spot would be appreciated by all citizens.

Behalf of Children

Trustee Williams supported the idea and said the providing of playgrounds for the children was a serious proposition. At present the plots at Sixth and McBride were so broken up that they were of little use to anyone. They did not provide even playgrounds for the small children. If the road was diverted around it there would be a pretty fair block for sports. As it was it never would be satisfactory. On behalf of the children of Prince Rupert he asked that they give this consideration.

Trustee Rochester said there was a great deal for and against the proposal. He was afraid that when the city was built up, this section could be used better than as a playground. He thought if the small squares could be cultivated they could be used as gardens and as a place for smaller children.

Only Few Sites

Trustee Williams expressed the opinion that there was nothing better the property could be devoted to than to make it into a playground. They could not play baseball on the small plots as at present. They could easily get places where a perambulator could be taken but there were only a few sites suitable for a playground and this was one of them. At present it was too

which he can attain is \$2,280 per annum. I think the schedule should be reversed, and that when the official reaches this office after long years of patient work he should receive the maximum of \$2,280 and that thereafter the salary should be graded down to \$1,680. Because by the time the official has served for five years in this capacity, after many years of faithful service in the department, he is a subject for the old men's home. Where you have a man, such as we have at the present time, in charge of the district office in district No. 2, and where he commences at \$110 a month, I consider such a salary is not in the interest of true economy.

I would suggest, as I have already stated, that \$1,000 of the money saved in the manner indicated, be appropriated to the three fishery districts, and distributed in such a way as to improve the working conditions of the men who work in the fishery offices.

From the standpoint of athletics, there is "everything" in favor of bringing together the four squares at the corner of McBride Street and Sixth Avenue and making one large recreation park of them and, under present conditions in the city, there would seem to be no serious objection to the proposition. Certainly another sports ground is needed here and one so close to the centre of the city would be greatly appreciated. The idea will, however, be opposed on the grounds that a straight thoroughfare on McBride Street should not be diverted and that, if the city expanded rapidly, such a recreation park would be too close in to be desirable. There will be plenty of other arguments for and against the project.
