DEATH RAY

Actual Test Carried Out by Government Proves Invention Ineffective

LONDON, June 5. - The deadly power of the death ray, which was recently invented and offered for sale to the government, falled to materialize in recent government tests, the House of Commons was told today by William Keach, under secretary of air ministry.

During the tests, Mr. Keach said, one of the ministry's experts placed himself in the path of the ray only ten yards distant from the point of emanation. If the inventor's claim had been borne out the expert ought to have disappeared. Instead, the under-secretary was pleased to report, he was doing very nicely and when last seen showed little signs of having suffered.
