### SURVEY PARTY RETURNS HOME

A. E. Wright and His Men Arrive Here After Exciting Experience off Lawn Hill Buoy

A. E. Wright, B.C.L.S. and his party consisting of J. Paton, Roger Wright and L. Hinton returned to the city yesterday from the Queen Charlotte Islands where they have been engaged this summer in coast triangulation work. They left their gas boat Ethelda at Skidegate where it is possible she may remain for the winter.

The work this year was conducted very successfully, Mr. Wright reports. There was only one experience that approached the point of excitement, that occurring last Thursday when the party was setting out for Prince Rupert on the Ethelda. Near Lawn Hill buoy, the engine broke down. This being in the evening, the anchors were thrown over and in the morning two men were sent ashore to obtain assistance. Meantime, rough weather had come up but the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. boat Chief Legaic, Capt. Charles Svendsen, reached the distressed craft late that night, making the seventeen-mile trip from Skidegate to Lawn Hill in the face of a howling southeast wind and in pitch darkness. Mr. Wright and his companion were taken to safety and, later, the Legaic towed the Ethelda to Skidegate. The party decided to leave the Ethelda there and made the passage across Hecate Straits home in a fish boat.

### COMYN CHING SAYS CHURCH IS NECESSARY

Rector of Edmonton Declares Russia is Today Raising Fiends Instead of Men and Women

EDMONTON, Oct. 3.—Russia is today raising fiends instead of men and women, said Rev. J. Comyn-Ching in a sermon here.

"Can we do without the church?" asked the preacher. "Russia has said it could, and today is raising fiends instead of men and women. It has endeavored to stamp out the living church, and there is no hope for stricken Russia until there is reborn within her confines, that great spiritual regeneration. The church, the body of Christ, is Russia's only salvation."

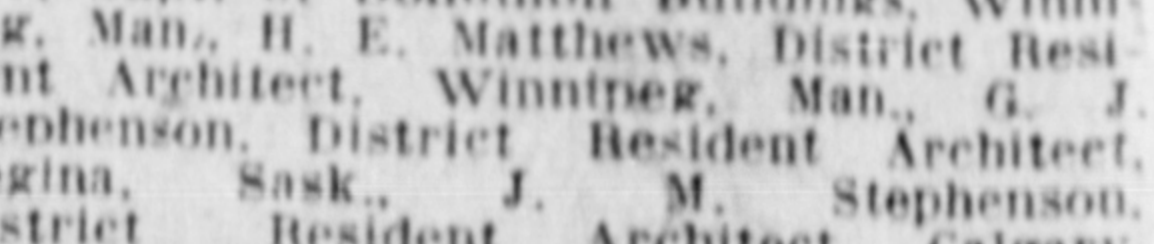
