RATES OF PAY FOR AIR FORCE GAZETTED

Flying Officers Begin at \$2,350 Per Annum Rising With Rank and Service

Rates of pay for all ratings in the Royal Canadian Air Force, as published in the Canada Gazette recently gave a complete summary of the remuneration for the various branches of the service in its flying, technical and other departments.

On the general list of the permanent force pilot officers will receive \$2,100 per annum, rising to \$2,200 after two years in that rank. Flying officers will receive \$2,350 per annum, rising to \$2,750 after five years in that rank. Flight lieutenants \$2,850 to \$3,150; squadron leaders, \$3,300 to \$3,600; wing commanders, \$3,700 to \$4,000; group captains, \$4,300 to \$4,700 per annum. Non-flying officers in the permanent service will receive from \$1,300 to \$3,200 according to rank and length of service.

Standard rates for airmen per day show sergeant-majors, first class, at \$4; second class, \$3.40; flight sergeants, \$3; sergeants, \$2.75; corporals, \$2.25; leading A.M., \$2; aircraftmen, first class, \$1.90; second class, \$1.70; boys, 75c per day. An increase totaling twenty-five cents a day may be secured after six years' service. Trades and clerical staff will receive from \$2.15 to \$4.25 per day according to rank and length of service. Allowance for quarters and other contingencies are provided.

The regulations deal fully with the married and single allowances, permanent and peace time establishments, rationing and other matters.
