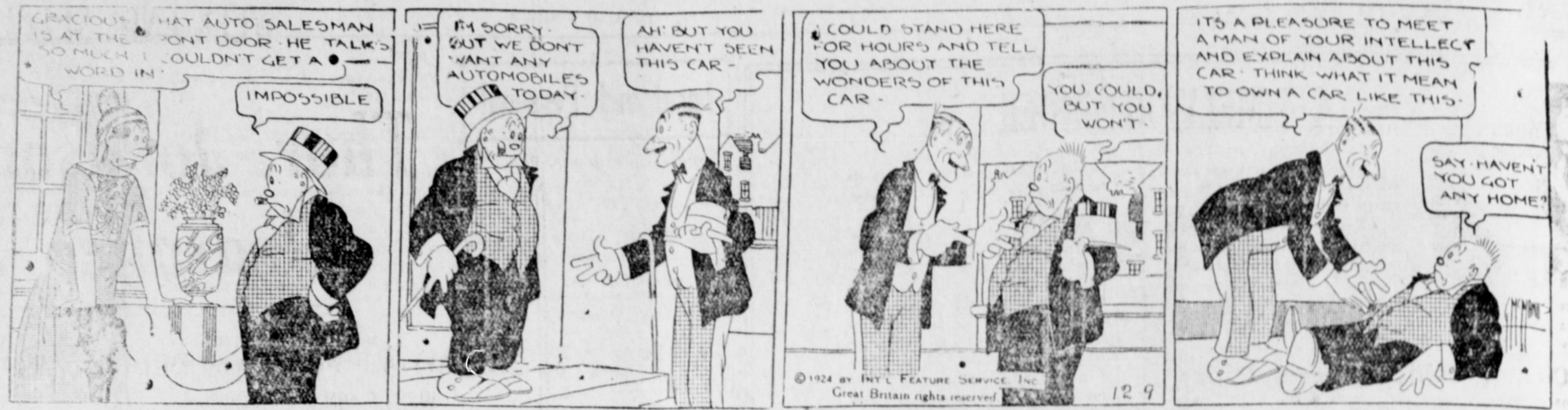

SHIPPING BUSINESS TENDS TO IMPROVE

LONDON, Dec. 10.—A hint of better things in store for the shipping trade was given at the recent annual dinner of the Institute of Marine Engineers by Sir Ernest Chamber, president in 1923 of the Chamber of Shipping. There were indications, the speaker said, that shipowners were nearing the end of the slump. Laid-up tonnage today, he said, was a great deal less than at any time during the last 18 months, and "we are on the road to establishing equilibrium between the amount of tonnage available and the amount of cargoes to be carried.
