in the newspapers. But they mooh into town after a voyage as if nothing had happened and nobody ever hears or thinks anything about it."

Mr. Bushby then launched into an exhortation for the conservation of fish and fish products. Thinking nothing of posterity but only of immediate gain, the inclination now was to waste. The present generation did not seem to care for anything but how much they could make and how easily it could be made.

Concrete Example Giving concrete evidence of how a commodity formerly wasted might be put to good use, Mr. Bushby referred to the work of his own bi-products plant. Every ton of halibut heads, he stated, produced thirty gallons of fish oil and 400 pounds of edible fish meal.

The Pacific coast had a marvellous preponderance in capability of fish production. Mr. Bushby declared, and the time would come when all varieties of fish would be handled without exception.

"There is too much of inclination today to sit around and wait for the other fellow to come and put your food into your mouth. If you do not help yourselves, nobody else is going to help you."

Inadequate Facilities

Mr. Bushby concluded his remarks by referring to the inadequacy of accommodation on the waterfront for the mosquito fleets. "It is a crime," he said "that you do not give these people a chance to get ashore in a decent manner without having to impose themselves on private bounty or ask favors.

After Mr. Bushby's address the proceedings closed, Mr. Johnson thanking the speakers and artists and also the ladies who had graced the banquet with their attendance.
