

Germans will Accept Dawes Report and will put Through Legislation

LONDON, Aug. 5.-Premier Ramsay Macdonald, presiding plenary session of the inter-Allied conference at noon today, prmally handed to the German delegation a protocol embodying he program of the conference for the putting of the reparations' xperts' report into effect.

The Premier asked the Germans to study the report and be eady to express their opinions tomorrow. He also said that he anted to bring the conference to an early end-by Friday night possible.
