

Cow Bay by P. Burns

P. Burns & Co. Ltd., are to erect an abbatoir here and packing house plant which will be designed primarily for use in nandling the stock raised in the Bulkley Valley and in distributing the Burns products to all the north coast points. The cost of the new building at present planned will be about \$25,000, but it will be capable of extension.

At the meeting of the city council last night, letters from W. J. Blake Wilson, general manager of the company at Vancouver, and from R. Moore, the local manager, asking for permission to erect the building and

permission granted subject to the vise of the medical health officer. A site has already been leased from the railway company on the foreshore between Cow Bay and

the Imperial Oil dock. It has a frontage of 100 feet and is eminently well suited for the purpose, being close to the road and track. It is adjoining the Bay property some years ago.
