## THORNTON WILL VISIT HUDSON'S BAY THIS YEAR TO INVESTIGATE

WINNIPEG, May 7.—Six delegates from "On-to-the-Bay" Association met Sir Henry Thornton, president of the Canadian National Railways, to lay before him their reasons for pressing for the completion of the railroad to Hudson Bay. G. F. Gray who headed the delegation and acted as spokesman, outlined to Sir Henry the benefits which he contended would be derived from the completion of this railway.

The railroad president said if the government would vote the money for the project he was perfectly willing to go through with it. He said that he had found it very difficult to get the actual facts with regard to the railway, as both supporters and proposers were very enthusiastic in presenting their respective cases as to whether or not the project was a good one, and he stated that he intended to visit the area right up to the Bay in the summer of this year with a view to acquiring some first hand information.

as \$1,452 to the ton. The high-grade lead is 4 feet 6 inches at the surface and apparently about the same width where it was cut by the drill. We ran through several other veins which have not yet been assayed."

Mr. Wood stated that the Taltapin, which is about 23 miles from the railway, is a silver-lead property with gold showings. At a meeting of shareholders held since his return, he stated it had been decided to sink a shaft and ship ore as quickly as possible.

The company has spent about \$35,000 in development, has its buildings and road constructed and about 160 feet of tunnelling done.

George Westman of Marpole is president of the company and W. C. Stearman secretary-treasurer.

Other properties near the Taltapin are also being developed extensively and good showings are reported on the Silver Island mine and the Duthie mine in the Highland Basin group. High assays of gold and silver have been made on the latter quite recently.
