ALL CANADIAN ROUTE FOR CARRYING GRAIN

United States railways and through United States canals to United States ports on the Atlantic. The real "all Canadian" route is the westward route. Grain shipped from Alberta to Vancouver or Prince Rupert does not leave Canadian territory until it is aboard ship, and all the expenses incidental to handling it go into Canadian pockets. The western route has been opposed on the ground that it diverts traffic from eastern Canadian railways and ports. It does nothing of the kind. It keeps in Canada a share of the trade which would otherwise go to United States railways, canals and ports.

The eastern Canadian channels and ports have quite all they can do to handle the one-third of the eastward-going grain that passes through them. Were it not for the consent of our neighbors to the passage of Canadian grain through their country there would be a condition of perpetual blockade all the way from Winnipeg to Halifax.
