WASHINGTON, May 30 .- Opponents of modification of the Volstead Act to permit 2.75 per cent of alcoholic content in beverages, made a general attack on pending bills which would provide for such a change in the act at concluding hearings today of the house judiciary committee on the question. Chairman Graham, at adjournment, announced that the taking of testimony had been completed, but arguments of counsel of opposing sides would be heard before the committee began framling its report.

Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel of the Anti-Saloon League, led off in the attack, asserting that "prohibition enforcement is not a failure."

"The record of 1923," he declared, "shows that fines of more than \$5,000,000, and jail sentences amounting to 2,241 years, were imposed, and 34,067 LIQUOR-CONTROL PLEBISCITES convictions oblained. The liquor lax penalties and assessments amount to approximately \$40 .-PROCLAMATION OF RETURNING OFFICER 000,000. The lower the alcoholic content of beverages, the lower the jail population.
