FELL INTO GEARS FIRST DAY AT WORK

Death of Ole Olsen at Kelly's Camp, Lagoon Bay, Took Place First Day He Was on Job

 SKIDEGATE, Sept. 18. — Ole Olsen, donkey engineer at Kelly's camp at Lagoon Bay, met death recently from an accident. He had just received a signal to go ahead when he slipped and got his arm caught between the piston rod and the gears which mangled his arm and crushed his skull.

 Mr. Olsen was a native of Norway and was 38 years of age. The morning he got hurt was his first day at work in the camp. It is believed he has relatives at Chicago. The body was brought to Queen Charlotte for burial.

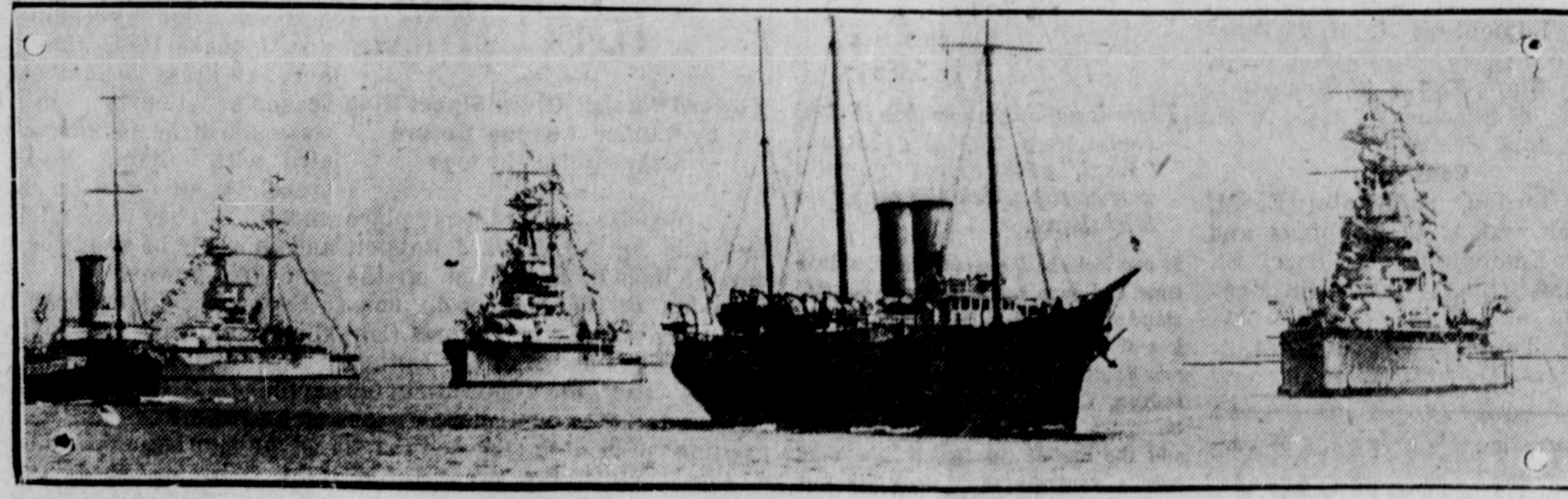
