WEATHER MAN NOW AT DIGBY

Local Meteorological Station Being Moved: Prominent Victoria Official Here

The federal government meteorological bureau, which has been conducted in Westview for the past couple of years by H. O. Crew, is being moved to the Digby wireless station where it will be located in future. F. Napier Denison, superintendent of Gonzales Heights meteorological observatory, Victoria, and one of the recognized weather authorities of the coast, arrived yesterday afternoon from the south to supervise the making of the transfer and will be here until Saturday. The equipment is being moved today and the station will be in operation at Digby Island tomorrow with S. C. Jackson, chief operator at the wireless station, in charge. One of the chief reasons for making the change is that direct communication by wireless will be available with other important stations on the coast.

FATHER OF J. C. GAVIGAN DIES TORONTO HOSPITAL

PARIS, Sept. 18.—Premier Herriot of France narrowly escaped injury in Marueille last night when two hundred Communists, swinging canes and sticks and shouting "amnesty," made determined efforts to surround and mob the premier in Rue Cambes, the main thoroughfare. Herriot was rescued from the excited mob only after the police, who arrived belatedly, forced back the Communists and dispersed the gathering.

DINOSAUR BONES UNCOVERED

SALT LAKE CITY.—The remains of another dinosaur, pronounced the second largest yet found, have been unearthed in the Jensen, Utah, fossil field by Professor Earl Douglas of the Carnegie Institute. The skeleton is estimated to weigh between five and six tons and the leg bones of the prehistoric animal are 12 to 13 feet in length.
