## BLACKWOOD on Bridge

### Opening Two Bid Is Often Dangerous

You can shade your opening two bids a little when you have a partial. But not much. Don't be like Mr. Muzzy who, when he has a 40 partial, opens with two spades, holding six spades to the ace, king, nothing and a side ace.

"I was only bidding to the score," he wails, when his partner, holding a fine hand, raises him to six and he goes set. A little thought will convince anyone that it's not necessary or desirable to open hands like that with a two bid.

If partner has anything, he will take some action over a one-bid. If he has nothing, then the enemy will have three aces, two kings and practically all of the queens and jacks.

Do you think they will sit there on their hands and blandly pass? Of course not. They will go ahead and reach a game contract of their own. Or, if the spades are blanked in one of their hands, they may double you and take you for a basket of points.

menace to industrial activity, employment and standards of living than the threat of a fall in consumer demand.

The treasury bulletin says exports to other sterling countries are beginning to be affected by restrictions found necessary to put their own economies on a sound basis.

"This loss of sterling markets," it declares, "must be made up and more by expansion elsewhere."

Although United Kingdom exports to all dollar countries during the first five months of 1952 were six per cent below last year's average, the report states that April saw an important improvement in exports to Canada and the United States.

"These success in non-sterling and particularly in dollar markets are encouraging," it says, "but they are small in relation to the problem that still remains."
