BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Stretch a Point and Answer Partner's Bid

Here is another angle about bidding when your side has an advanced part score. If your partner opens and next hand passes, it is usually best to respond on the thinnest of excuses.

In other words, respond unless your hand is entirely devoid of high card or distributional advantages.

When you have a partial of 60, for example, and partner opens the bidding with one of a suit, he may have enough in his own hand to take seven or eight tricks.

Then there is the possibility that an opponent will get off to an opening lead that is favorable to your side. Or the opponents may defend badly later in the hand and enable you to make two-odd.

Even if your partner's opening is near minimum it is worth taking the gamble of going set one more trick to give yourself the chance of completing your game for which there is a handsome bonus.

In today's hand, Mr. Masters

should have passed his partner's one diamond bid if there had been no part score. With only one queen and one jack and a worthless doubleton in diamonds, he doesn't have enough to make a sound response of any kind.

With the partial, however, he should give his side the opportunity of reaching game. He is assured of one important thing—that his partner will not get the bidding beyond the two level unless he has a really big hand, because two in any suit will make game.

One word of caution about all this. Always consider the Humanities of the situation. Don't stretch too far for a bid when Mr. Muzzy is your partner.

He may have forgotten about the partial and he may leap blithely to four-odd when you give him a shaded raise. But when you have a good partner who knows what he's doing, stretch to the limit to fill out your game.

THE BIRD CALLS were recorded in Algonquin Park by Dr. William Gunn, secretary of the Federation of Ontario Naturalists, and the tape-recording of the songs was obtained by Pete, outdoors editor of the Toronto Telegram.

McGill records how Dr. Gunn had an exciting time getting the bird calls on tape. While setting up his microphone Dr. Gunn had to keep his eye on three bears feeding in a garbage dump, which happened to be a singing post for the whippoorwill.

The bird call was not coming in strong enough at first, so Dr. Gunn planted an amplifier and played back some calls to the whippoorwill to get it started.

The bird co-operated perfectly by flying down to the ground near the mike and letting loose its oft-repeated call.

In the meantime, the bears were busy with their rummaging in the dump and did not interfere with the operations.

Besides bringing a familiar sound to country dwellers, the broadcast bird call is bringing thrills to city dwellers, especially shut-in and elderly folk who may have come from the farm or village many years ago.

Egyptians Go to Polls Next Year

CAIRO—Egypt will go to the polls next February to choose a new government.

General Mohammed Naguib announced today that the election would be held early next year soon after political groups had been warned that their ranks would be purged if they did not want the army "to deal with them in any other way."

The army, a dominant factor in Egyptian life since it ended the rule of King Farouk, emphasized its key position by announcing its units will carry out maneuvers this week in the Cairo area.

Mechanized forces began clanking through streets at dawn.

The army said in its statement that it has "declared war against corruption." It also demanded immediate reforms to better the life of Egypt's poverty-stricken masses.
