EDMONTON BUILDING IS GUTTED BY FIRE

Firemen Had Tough Time Trying to Prevent Spread to Other Premises

EDMONTON, Jan. 23.— Fire, which is supposed to have originated from a gasoline stove in the Mason Coffee Club above the Eastern Cafe in the Campbell furniture annex, at the rear of the McLeod building completely gutted the building, which was owned by the Franco-Canadian Mortgage Company. Besides these two occupants, the rest of the building was used by Campbell for storage, and only three days before he moved the larger part of a ten thousand dollar stock into the building. His loss is a heavy one, as he carried only \$5,000 insurance.

Flames were pouring out of the roof when the firemen arrived and they had a tough fight to prevent it spreading to the buildings on either side including a gas station that was twenty feet away. The roof fell in, within fifteen minutes. Seven lines of hose were laid and the new pump at the first corner west was into action with four lines of hose. Severe cold made the fight a hard one.

CANADA THIRD IN MERCHANTABLE TIMBER

Losses from Fire Very Large and Soon Will be Nothing Left if Conditions Continue

MONTREAL, Jan. 23.—Fifteen years lease of life was the limit of Canadian lumber hopes owing to present day timber cutting operations and forest fires, according to Lt.-Col. Lindsay Gordon, commandant of the Air Force in Canada, who addressed members of the original Naval Air Force at a luncheon here.

Col. Gordon stated that the losses in the last three years were those on which he based his figures. In the last five years Canada had lost \$15,000,000 a year by forest fires. In this loss was not taken into consideration the money to the pulp companies, railways or to the employment of men. At the present time Canada only ranked third in the timber limits of the world. This fact, said Col. Gordon, was not realized by many who were of the opinion that Canada had the greatest timber limits in the world. Russia ranked first, the United States second, and the Dominion third.
