Well Known Barber Who Passed Through Here Recently Writes to Victoria Paper

One peculiarity about Stewart is the method of supplying electric light, says J. A. Shanks, the Victoria barber now located at Stewart, writing to the Victoria Colonist. The "juice" is turned on at the close of the day, according to the time of year and discontinued at dawn. Everybody pays a flat rate. Therefore the town's well lighted all through the night. Shut-offs on lights are as scare in Stewart as keys were for bar room doors in the hilarious days of old.
