BIG HOTELS BEING PLANNED IN LONDON

Hostelry of 1,000 Rooms Soon to be Erected—Another One of 3,000 Rooms Proposed

LONDON, Dec. 20.—London is soon to have a giant hotel of 1,000 rooms, built and equipped along the lines of some of Canada's big hotels and within five years the British capital expects to see work begun on another super-hotel, which, according to present plans, will have 3,000 rooms and be the largest in the world. Work on the first hotel, to be called the Royal and situated in Bloomsbury, will begin this winter and completion will take about two years. Later the structure will be increased to 2,000 rooms.

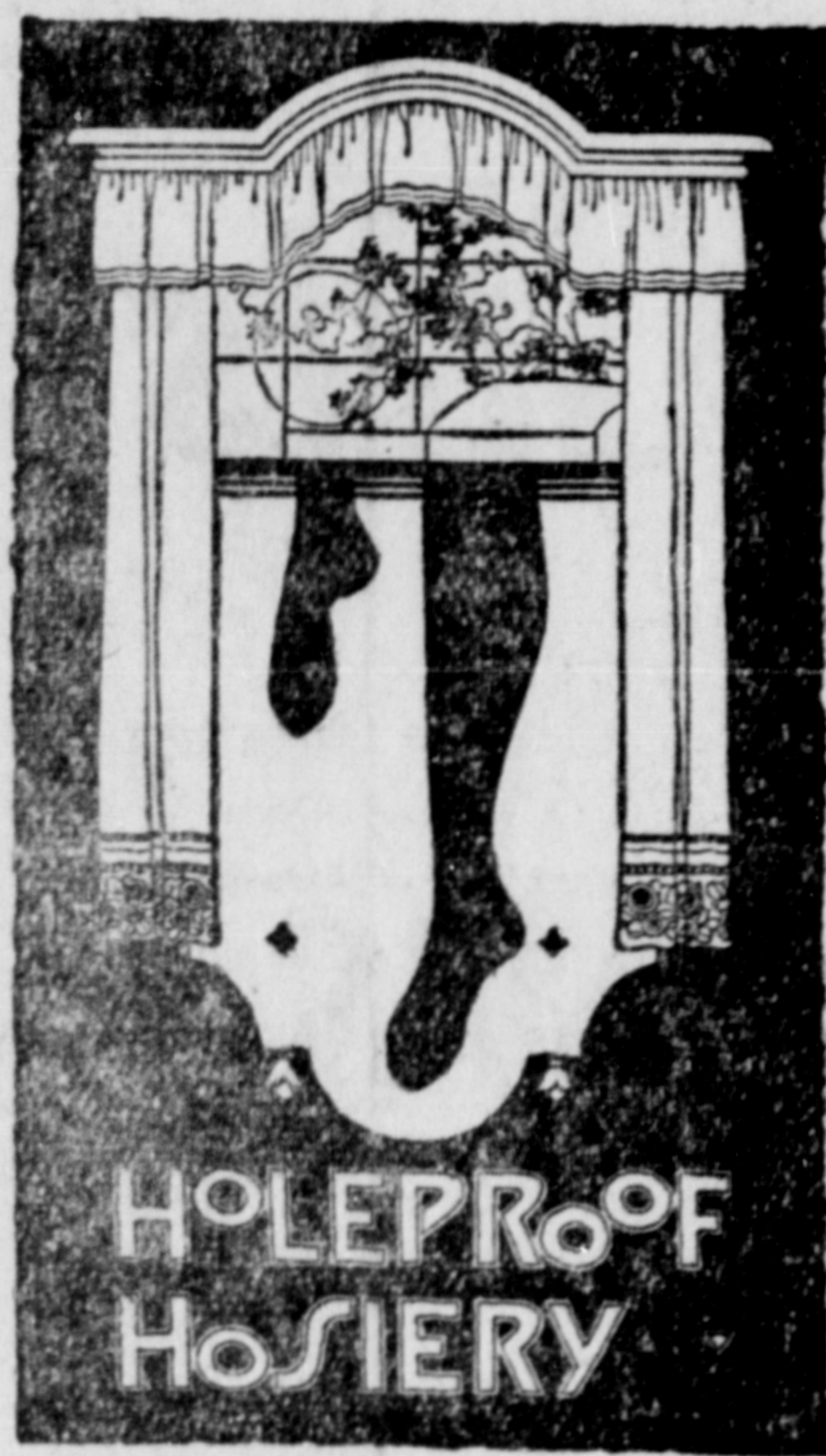
