## JUSTICE HOLDS ALL WOMEN AS EQUAL

Michigan Jurist Says, in Opinion, There Must be No Discrimination

LANSING, Mich., Jan. 21.—There must be no discrimination between "pink tea" attendants and scrub-women, or between society women and Magdalenes, in the application of the law, Justice Grant Fellows, of the Michigan supreme court, held in an opinion made public recently.

The opinion was rendered in a suit for damages brought by Mrs. Nina D. Bennett, of Allegan county, who charged that several men and women, some of them masked, visited her home in June 1921, pulled her through a narrow window, stood her against a wall and pelted eggs at her.

Affirming the decision of a lower court in favor of Mrs. Bennett, Justice Fellows declared the defendants "by able and adroit counsel sought to besmirch Mrs. Bennett's character."

"The community look the law into its own hands to administer it according to the ethics of the stone age," he said. "It is our proud boast that all are equal before the law. If we deviate from this we must adopt one measure of damages for the attendant of pink teas and another for the scrubwoman; one for the society woman and another for the Magdalene."
