## CANADIAN NATIONAL CONCERT THURSDAY

Official Opening at Winnipeg on that Occasion from Manitoba Government Station

WINNIPEG, March 27.—Official opening of Canadian National Railways' radio program in Winnipeg takes place Thursday evening from the Manitoba government broadcasting station CKY 450 meters, a musical program will "go on the air" at 8.30 o'clock and will be interspersed with an address from Sir Henry Thornton to be read here and a speech by A. A. Tisdale, assistant to the general manager of the western region, in the absence from the city of A. E. Warren.

Byron Edmund Walker, a son of Alfred E. Walker, of Hamilton, Ont., was born in the township of Seneca, Haldimand County, Ont., on October 14, 1848. He was educated in the public schools of Hamilton. Although lacking a university education, he was the recipient of honorary university degrees. The University of Toronto conferred upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Civil Laws. He served as a member of the Board of Governors of the Toronto University, trustee of the Toronto General Hospital, founder and president of the Champlain Society, 1905, and a member of the Quebec Battlefield Commission.

Knights in 1910, Sir Edmund Walker was presented to King George at St. James Palace in June 1911. In the year of his knighthood being conferred upon him he was created a Knight of Grace, Order of St. John of Jerusalem.

Sir Edmund was a former consul of Japan; and local secretary in connection with the meetings in Toronto in 1897 of the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

In 1874 Sir Edmund married Mary Alexander, daughter of Alexander Alexander, of Hamilton, Ontario. Four sons and three daughters were born to them. Sir Edmund was a member of the following clubs: Toronto, York, Lambton Golf and Country, Toronto Hunt, Royal Canadian Yacht, and the Rideau, Ottawa. In religion he was a Presbyterian.

Canada were the better for it. He was widely known as an authority on banking, and was the author of several works on the subject, his views and influence having extended beyond Canada. In Toronto he was esteemed as a good citizen, a patriot, a friend to every worthy cause, and an active supporter of a number of philanthropies. He had an exceptionally large circle of personal friends.

## An Art Connoisseur

In his capacity as an art connoisseur Sir Edmund was president of the Federal Commission to select works of art for the National Art Gallery, Ottawa. He was an enthusiastic supporter of the Toronto Art Museum, which is the richer by several paintings given by him. The Royal Ontario Museum, this city, also has benefited by splendid gifts from Sir Edmund Walker.

Best known to the public as a banker, Sir Edmund Walker was president of the Canadian Bank of Commerce from the year 1907 until his death. He was president of the Canadian Bankers' Association for some time. His first banking experience was gained in the private bank of his uncle, J. W. Merton, Hamilton, Ont.

He became discount clerk in the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in 1868, and his advancement in that financial institution was steady until he reached the position of president. He had reached the general management of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in 1886.

He was a former vice-president of the American Bankers' Association, and a Fellow of the Institute of Bankers of England.

## SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

### PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 14 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 5,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 1,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emption must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

### PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stumpage.

### HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

### LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

### GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
