## GERMANS DETERMINED LEAVE THEIR COUNTRY

Rush to United States is Stopped and They Look Elsewhere for Home

HAMBURG, Jan. 31.—Canada, South America and Russia are the three countries toward which prospective German emigrants are turning their eyes since the United States quota became exhausted.

Steamship offices are today besieged by disappointed Germans who had planned to go to America. Many of them had sold their farm utensils, their household goods and even their personal effects to raise money for the trip. It is impossible for them to wait in Germany till the new American quota opens next July, and most of them are determined to go somewhere.

"We can't be worse off than we are in Germany," is the universal reply they make when emigration officials caution them it is not wise to jump into some unknown land without funds and with no friends to look after them. Many Germans seem obsessed at the present time by the idea that they must leave the fatherland. This is especially true of young men, who insist they can see no future for them at home, and it applies particularly to clerks, teachers, stenographers, government employees and other "white-collar" workers. Such persons are not encouraged to emigrate, but household servants and farm laborers are.

## THE WRONG BOX

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—Burglars got into the home of William Ross, at 145 Thirty-fifth Street, Woodliff, N.J., recently, while Mr. and Mrs. Ross were absent. There were two boxes on a table in Mrs. Ross' room. The intruders opened one, found it full of candy and stopped to munch it until the hour grew so late they began to fear the return of the family. Finding nothing else to their taste in the room, they tore down the curtains, upset furniture and departed.

In the box which they failed to open was several thousand dollars' worth of jewellery. Mrs. Ross found it intact on her return.

## LAYS HEAVY HAND ON PEOPLE OF AMOY, CHINA

Taxes Collected on Everything Used or Eaten in State: Hard Times

AMOY, China, Jan. 31.—All the country surrounding Amoy, including Chinbay, is now in possession of northern troops. Amoy City and island is the only territory remaining in the hands of General Chuang Chihping, who took Amoy by force 18 months ago.

General Chuang holds a heavy hand over the city. He collects taxes on wines and tobacco and many other commodities. Every fowl sold in the market pays five cents, and every hundred eggs 20 cents. Firecrackers and paper pay 20 per cent, electric current 15 per cent. From 10 to 20 cents are collected on every pair of shoes sold; householders pay two months rent, every peddler gives up two dollars, and every shop 20 per cent of its income.

Hence rich and poor alike in Amoy are complaining of hard times. Also there is much robbery, and the criminals are seldom, if ever, caught and punished.

## RATS WERE KILLED SO WERE SAILORS

Danger From Fumigating Ships While Passengers and Crew Aboard

HAVRE, Jan. 31.—The danger of fumigating the holds of ships to exterminate rats without first clearing the whole ship of passengers and crew has been brought strongly to the attention of the French government as a result of the recent suffocation of several members of the crew of the Caroline.

The report to the government points out that, despite all possible precautions, it is impossible effectively to fumigate one hold without allowing the deadly fumes to seep through to other parts of the ship. Stricter regulations for "de-ratting" ships are expected soon to be put into effect.

## SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

**PRE-EMPTIONS**  
 Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 3,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 8,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

**PURCHASE**  
 Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stumpage.

**HOMESITE LEASES**  
 Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

**LEASES**  
 For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 500 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

**GRAZING**  
 Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
