CARMANIA MAKES FIRST TRIP UP ST. LAWRENCE

Is Diverted from New York Trade and Will Now Ply to Canadian Ports

FATHER POINT, Que., April 26.—The Cunarder Carmania with a large passenger list from Liverpool and Belfast arrived at Father Point last night and will be at Quebec today on her maiden voyage up the St. Lawrence River. Awaiting her arrival at Father Point was a party of steamship and railway officials and newspaper men. They will accompany the vessel to Quebec.

Up to the present trip the Carmania, one of the finest ships of the Cunard fleet, has been a three class steamer running into New York. She now becomes a two class boat on the St. Lawrence route and is the largest vessel of her type that has ever sailed the river. During the war, owing to her speed, the Carmania was used as an auxiliary cruiser by the British Admiralty in addition to convoying troops and carrying more than twenty eight thousand soldiers herself, she had the distinction of ridding the seas of a German auxiliary cruiser more heavily armed than she was, when she fought and sank the Trafalgar in the South Atlantic in September 1914. For this feat she was awarded by the Navy League of England a piece of silver plate from Nelson's famous flagship Victory.
