IMMIGRANTS ARE ARRIVING

Approximately 3,500 Passengers Debarking at Week-end at Eastern Points

MONTREAL, Que., April 26.—Approximately 3,500 passengers will arrive at the ports of Halifax, Quebec and Montreal over the week-end according to reports received by James Morrison, general passenger agent for steamship traffic, Canadian National Railways. The majority of these passengers will proceed to their destinations by special trains over the National system. Of the number 1,168 will disembark at Halifax. The first boat to arrive will be the Orbita of the Royal Steam Packet Company from Hamburg and Southampton she is expected to dock sometime today and will be closely followed by the White Star liner Celtic which is bringing 206 passengers to Halifax from Liverpool. The President Wilson of the Cosulich line is also expected to arrive the same day.

On Sunday, the Cunard liner Saxonia from Liverpool will arrive at Halifax with 518 passengers. The majority of these are bound for points in Ontario and Western Canada, where they will take up agricultural work.

The St. Lawrence navigation season will be ushered in over the week-end with the arrival of some 2,000 passengers. The Germania will arrive at Quebec with 796. She will be followed by the Canada of the White Star Dominion line from Belfast and Glasgow with 442 passengers for Quebec, while tomorrow will see the arrival of another Cunarder, the Andania from Southampton, Cherbourg and Queenstown with close upon a thousand passengers for Quebec. The greater part of these passengers are bound for the farming districts of Ontario and Western Canada where they intend following agricultural pursuits and will proceed westward over the Canadian National Railways.
