suggests that settlers at least be allowed to take off the timber, under the same royalty payment terms as assessed the mill companies or logging outfits. An agreement might be reached whereby for every three acres thus logged off, one acre should be put under cultivation.

There are approximately 800 homesteads surveyed in the valley. Mr. Anderson says. If only 200 of these were taken up, it would mean that a regular boat and mail service would have to be instituted from Prince Rupert, which would be the distributing centre for supplies and all other requirements. At one time, there were 27 members of the Kitimaat Farmers' Institute. Now there are only five white settlers there. The war took many settlers away. Others became discouraged, mainly on account of transportation conditions and left. All that is required to bring it back and beyond its former stage of development is the withdrawal of the present

KITIMAAT AS FARM CENTRE

George L. Anderson Tells of Attractions and Difficulties in Valley

"The Kitimaat valley is the most fertile agricultural area tributary to Prince Rupert but, as a timber conservation measure, there is a reserve on it against settlement. Prince Rupert needs it as a feeder and we need Prince Rupert as a market. Legislation keeping the Kitimaat

valley in such a condition should be repealed in order to open it up again."

Such is the opinion of George L. Anderson, pioneer settler of the Kitimaat valley, who returned home last night after having spent a week in the city. Mr. Anderson went in to the Kitimaat valley in 1891 and, but for a period of two years or so, has resided there continuously since. He was the first white man in Kitimaat. He took up the first land there, built the first house and brought in the first horse. He has seen the valley progress through times of much promise and during recent years, on account of being closed to settlement and because of inadequate transportation, dwindle until now there are only five white settlers there.

Wants Boat Service

Besides wanting the valley reopened to settlement, Mr. Anderson wants to see instituted a regular boat service between it and Prince Rupert and a telephone connection by way of Terrace.

As evidence of the valley's fertility, Mr. Anderson points out that he himself raised 4 1/2 tons of hay and 45 tons of potatoes per acre. It is 125 miles by water from Prince Rupert. The valley runs north and south and is always open to the sun. The soil is of a fertile alluvial silt nature prolific in growth possibilities. Stock may be raised there to as good if not better advantage than any other section of the north.

If the timber conservation idea must be continued, Mr. Anderson

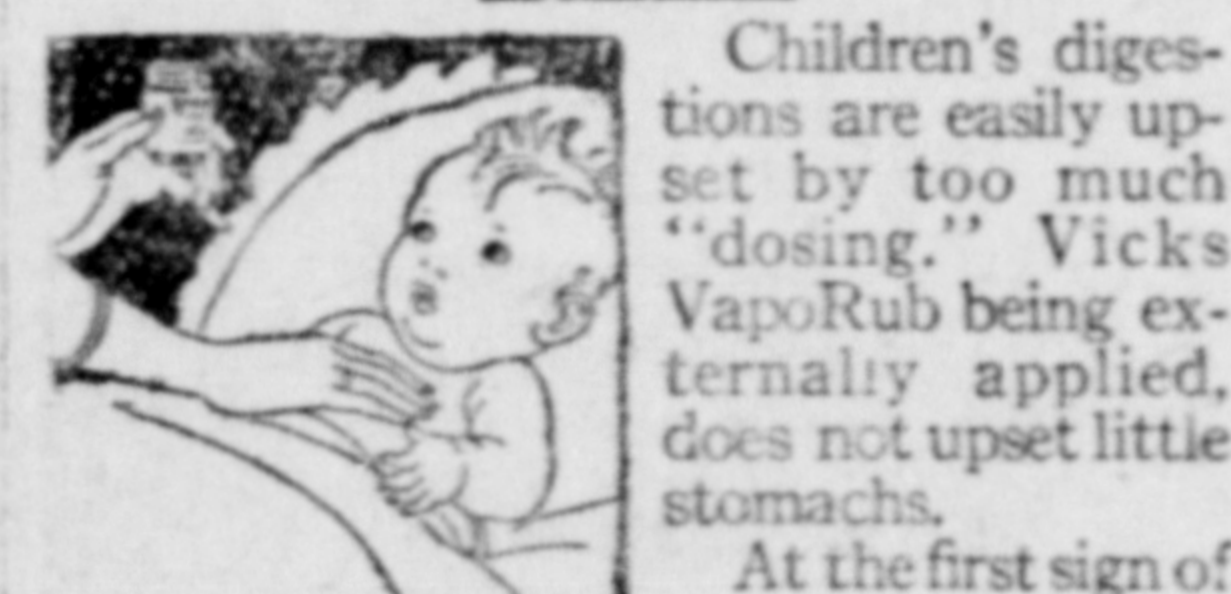
