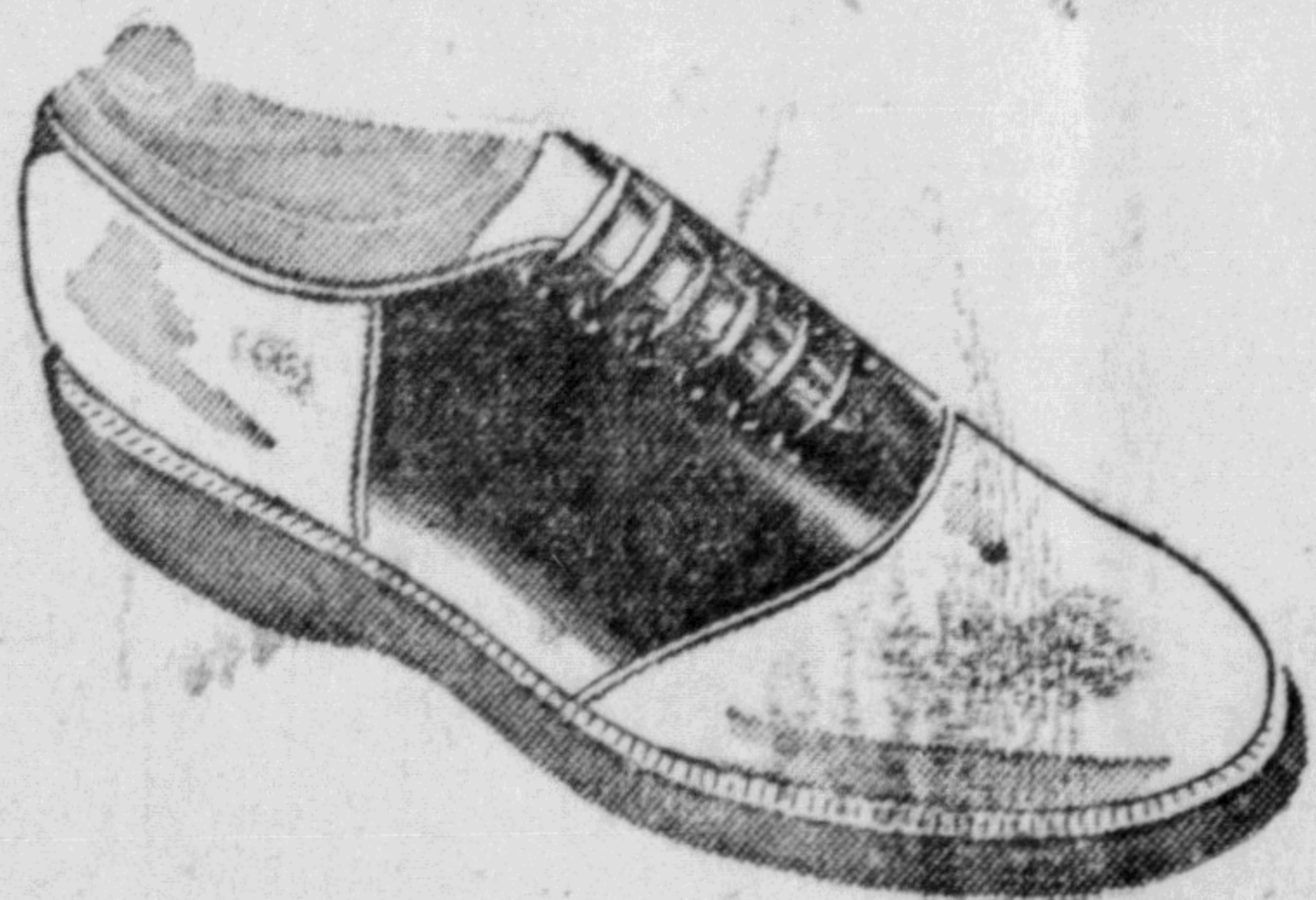

**French Climbers Try African Mountains**

PARIS (Reuters)—Eight French mountaineers, inspired by the recent success of French expeditions in India and South America, plan to set out this month to tackle three snow-capped giants of Africa.

The targets of the African expedition will be Kilimanjaro (19,565 feet), just inside the Tanganyika frontier, about 18 miles southwest of Nairobi; Ru-

enzori (16,750 feet) in Western Uganda; and Mount Kenya (17,000 feet) in Central Kenya. Maurice Martin, leader of the expedition, explained that an increasing number of French climbers felt the challenge of non-European mountain peaks. "Mountaineering began in France as a sport 90 years ago. Since then all our peaks have been scaled," Martin said. "The

sport has become popular and the mountains so crowded that solitude, one of the mountaineer's delights, can no longer be found in France—we go to Africa."

French expeditions have always combined science with mountain climbing. The Club Alpin, of which all the Kenya party are members, has a scientific commission of 70 mountaineer scholars which collates geological, botanical and glaciological information obtained in the course of expeditions.

**Freighter Sunk by Guns  
Salvaged in Halifax Port**

HALIFAX (C)—A freighter sunk by naval gunfire in Halifax harbor, after catching fire while loading ammunition for a convoy in the last war, now is being salvaged for scrap.

Ironically, a team of German divers is doing the job. They are a father-and-sons combination headed by Karl Ross, 57-year-old veteran with 30 years' diving experience. His sons Karlheinz and Egon are the fourth generation of their family to follow the same vocation.

Working 60 feet down in the harbor, the three operate in shafts, breaking up the freighter Trongate with explosives and torches. While one is below, the others keep sharp watch from a tender, maintaining continuous conversation with the man below as a safety check.

Karlheinz handled the first part of the Trongate job, cutting a 30-foot section of the bow free from the remainder of the vessel. Egon was assigned the next cutting duties and then father will go to work.

Two other men, not divers, round out the crew. They are Henry Weiland and Ernest Schmitt. Diving jobs previously have taken the Ross family to the waters of Norway, Spain and Sweden, but this is their first assignment in Canada.

VICTORIA, B.C. (C)—Fate of a famous "Pot of Gold" tea set manufactured in England for a British Columbia firm is a puzzle since King Farouk was ousted from the Egyptian throne. J. Courtney Haddock, director of a department store here, said the tea set made by English master craftsmen to the order of his firm had been sold instead to Farouk. He estimated the set, which contains 400 ounces of gold, was worth \$110,000.

While the monetary value of the set is not a record for such fine pieces of English craftsmanship, this particular design was described here as a masterpiece.
