Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 5.000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and \$,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Com missioner of the Land Recording Di vision, in which the land applied to is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be For more detailed information see

the Bulletin "How to Pre-empt PURCHASE

Applications are received for pur-

chase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land to 35 per acre, and second-class (grazing) and \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment stumpage.


