BASKETBALL AND OTHER MATCHES

Playground Nigh Was Well Patronized and Gyro Club's Fund is Benefitted Substantially

The basketball games and novelty features staged last night in the Elks' Home drew a large attendance and the Gyro Club's playground fund benefited very materially thereby. The program consisted of two regularly scheduled league basketball matches, a Senior exhibition game, a farce contest between the Rotary and Gyro Clubs and a bayonet duel. Other events had been arranged for but failed to materialize. The committee from the gyro Club in charge of the entertainment consisted of E. A. Mann, A. R. Nichols, S. W. Taylor and Leo Waugh.

The result of the games were as follows: Intermediate League—Grotto, 35; High School, 29. Ladies' League—Teachers, 35; Adanaes, 10. Senior League (exhibition)—Sons of Canada, 54; Colts, 29. Club game—Rotary 3, Gyro 2. The Grotto got away from the High School early in the intermediate League match and at half time the score was 26 to 15. The High School boys staged a rally in the second half but not sufficient points were made to overcome the lead and the final whistle marked their defeat by 35 to 29. The High School wasted too much energy on long shots where passes might have been more effective. The Grotto placed the ball consistently in the hands of their forward man, W. Wrathall, who made many fine shots.
