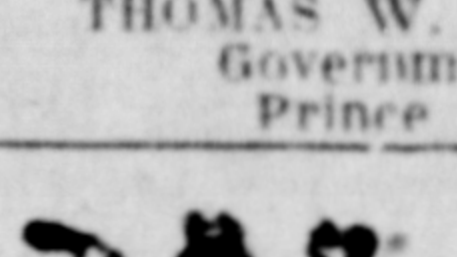
During the period when it was shut off from the rest of the village there have been many cases here and a number of young children succumbed.

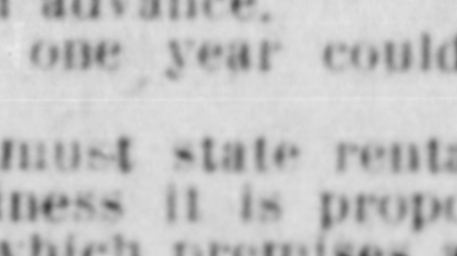

EDMONTON EGGS ARE DOWN TO 20C A DOZEN

EDMONTON, March 7. — Egg markets throughout the continent struck a big decline during the past ten days, owing to mild weather conditions and heavy production.

Edmonton prices being paid to producers by wholesalers have accordingly slumped again, and there is a very great difference in the price of 20 cents per dozen for extras at which price merchants were buying this week and that of just over two weeks ago, which was 40 cents per dozen.

Firsts are being bought at 18 cents per dozen, seconds at 15 cents and cracks at 10 cents, all f.o.b. Edmonton, and dealers report the market will be unsettled until prices arrive at a storage basis. This is not likely to take place until the warm weather is general, for the present cold nights cause eggs to chill, and they are thus useless for storage purposes, so it is not surprising that merchants will not take the risk.
