INDIAN GETS SHORT SENTENCE AT ASSIZES
Must Serve Fifteen Months at Okalla For Rape

A sentence of fifteen months at Okalla prison was imposed this morning by Mr. Justice Gregory on Alexander Gun-Goo-At, native of Hazelton, who pleaded guilty at the Supreme Court assizes to a charge of rape. The imprisonment will date from the time of accused's arrest, March 22.

On account of the fact that accused was the support of an aged mother and father, and also on account of his mental condition, David Whiteside, crown prosecutor, in the absence of defence counsel, asked that a lenient sentence be passed. Mr. Justice Gregory agreed with this view but, in passing sentence of fifteen months, emphasized the seriousness of the crime that had been committed and pointed out that it was within his power to sentence accused to be hanged.

DEPLORES USE OF MANY COSMETICS
Medical Professor at University Gives Address on Subject to Doctors

CHICAGO, June 12.—Cosmetics were described as instruments toward skin ills and homeliness, rather than auxiliaries of beauty when Prof. H. K. Cole, associate professor of dermatology at Western Reserve University, spoke today before the convention of the American Medical Association.

Prof. Cole deplored the increasing use of cosmetics, which he said were always harmful to the complexion, and revealed statistics showing their consumption and data on the prevalence of poisonous substances in many common beautifying agents.

Most Women Paint

"What was once considered poor form is now the mode with the average woman, certainly in cities," he said. "Most women paint; all of them use powders of different types. The average woman uses at least some of the long list of cosmetics, and yet many of these women are unaware of the danger they are running from such use."

"There is the pure mechanical obstruction by creams, powders, and rouges employed on the face. The pores of our skin were intended by nature to serve as lubricating and excretory ducts. If these are constantly closed off, the mechanical obstruction alone

BAD TIMES AFFECT NUMBER MARRIAGES
Scandinavian Countries Illustrate How Commercial Activity Makes for Matromy

COPENHAGEN, June 12.—Marriages in the Scandinavian countries show a steady decline from the high figures attained during and just after the war.

Denmark reached the marriage peak in 1920, when business was still flourishing and the bottom had not dropped out of shipping. There were 8.8 marriages that year to every 1000 persons, which was higher than the rate had been since 1854.

The climax was also reached in Sweden the same year, when there were 7.3 marriages to each 1000 persons. In Norway the peak was attained in 1918, with 7.8 weddings to each 1000 persons.

Industrial depression and commercial inactivity are reducing the marriage figures of all these countries materially, Norway now having fallen below all other European countries in its percentage of marriage.

TELLS HOW REDS WERE SIFTED FROM WHITES

WINNIPEG, June 12.—A sidelight on the Russian revolution was furnished by a lone immigrant who reached Winnipeg today. He was a refugee from the Volga district, chased out of there, so he said, by Trotsky's Red army. He served in the Russian Imperial army during the war against Germany, went through it unscathed, and had several months to serve when the army rebelled and turned Red.

Speaking through an interpreter relative to his experience with that army, he declared that it was customary for them when a town or village was captured, to make an inspection of all the inhabitants for the purpose of sifting out the Reds from the Whites. The manner of doing this was simplicity itself. Those with white, clean hands, were promptly shot, while those with dirt under their nails and calloused palms were preserved. He was compelled to flee from his home after his stock and implements had been commandeered by the army. He proposes to take up farming in one of the western provinces.
