Recreation Park for City Provided for in Agreement of Government and Railway

VICTORIA, Jan 8 .- Before leaving for Otlawa, Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of lands and member for Prince Rupert, explained what had been done by the legislature at his instigation to make the Salt Lakes available for Prince Rupert people for all time and to provide a park that would be a recreation centre.

The new park includes the whole of the two salt lakes and a good deal of land around them surveyed in such a manner as to make rectangular stretches including every arm of the lakes.
