#### HON. T. D. PATTULLO UPHOLDS POSITION IN LETTER TO PRESS

Against Misinformation Misrepresentation in Connection With Capilano Lands

The following letter was published in the Vancouver press from Prince Rupert's member:

Reports in the press indicate that the mayor of Vancouver proposes to ask me for an explanation of the sale of six limits in the Capilano watershed to private interests since the reserve of 1905.

The items have appeared in the press in this connection are based upon a communication, according to the press reports; sent to the Property Owners' Association, Vancouver. The information sent to the Property Owners' Association, Vancouver, indicated very clearly just how and when the imber limits referred to were! alienated, and the information was available before the publication of these reports.

I cannot come to any other conclusion than that these reports are deliberately published for the purpose of creating an impression in the public mind that this department, during the regime of the present administraton, has disposed of timber limits within the Capilano watershed since the placing of the reserve of 1905.
