## Major Martin Took off from Chignik at 11:10 Yesterday: Lost Since

Every Effort Being Bent Today to Ascertain Fate of Misfortune-dogged American Aviator

CORDOVA, May 1. - Major Frederick L. Martin, commander of the United States army round the world flight, is missing again in the North Pacific. Yesterday morning at 11.10 he left Chignik for Dutch Harbor, where he was to have joined his three companion aviators. Up to 5 o'clock this morning no further trace had been obtained of him. All wireless communication is now being brought into play and every available vessel has been despatched to search for him. Major Martin was flying the flag ship of the aerial cruiser squadron, the Seattle, and his mechanic was Staff Sergeant A. L. Harvey.



ATLANTA, Georgia, May 1. - With ninety-five persons known to be dead and more than a score missing and approximately 500 people injured some of them fatally, the southeast set about today to relieve the regions which were stricken yesterday and Tuesday by the worst high tension storm in history.
