## Kept Province

## To Fore In London.

F. C. Wade, the late agent general for British Columbia in London, always kept the province well to the fore in the world's metropolis and did it with a proper dignity. He was an ideal representative and British Columbia can ill afford to lose him.

There were many problems affecting the province which came up from time to time in London, and especially matters pertaining to the use of British Columbia lumber in place of similar material imported into England from foreign countries. Mr. Wade helped develop the imperial spirit by encouraging Englishmen to buy within the Empire. The task was a difficult one but he met with a measure of success in the undertaking.

It is to be hoped that the next appointee in the position will be as well equipped as was Mr. Wade to represent the province and to reach out to all parts of it.

## Senator Lodge Was American Politician.

Senator Lodge was an American politician, although he is often spoken of as a statesman, and he was that also. He was a politician because he was a great student of democratic methods of government, of organization and of constitutional practice. He was a great believer in party government and of the Republican party in particular. As leader of the Republicans in the Senate, he fought former President Wilson's policy and rightly or wrongly won out. In an interview a few years ago he is reported to have said:

"I have nothing to say about my opponents, for I have never made personal or abusive attacks on anyone opposed to me. It has always seemed to me that a man in public life stood more strongly if he stood on his merits rather than on someone else's defects. I think I may say that I have done a great deal of difficult and responsible public work. On that public work and on that record I am content to stand."

Senator Henry Cabot Lodge was born in affluence and never knew, as most statesmen have, what it meant to be in want. His father was a merchant, owner of ships, and there was every temptation for his son to live a life of ease. Instead of that he was a strenuous worker, studied law, and devoted himself to politics as a life work. For recreation he studied art and literature as all Cabots felt it their bounden duty to do. He spoke French almost as fluently as English. He travelled a great deal and counted among his friends a number of European statesmen. He was a big man and the American nation and especially the Republican party can ill afford to lose him.

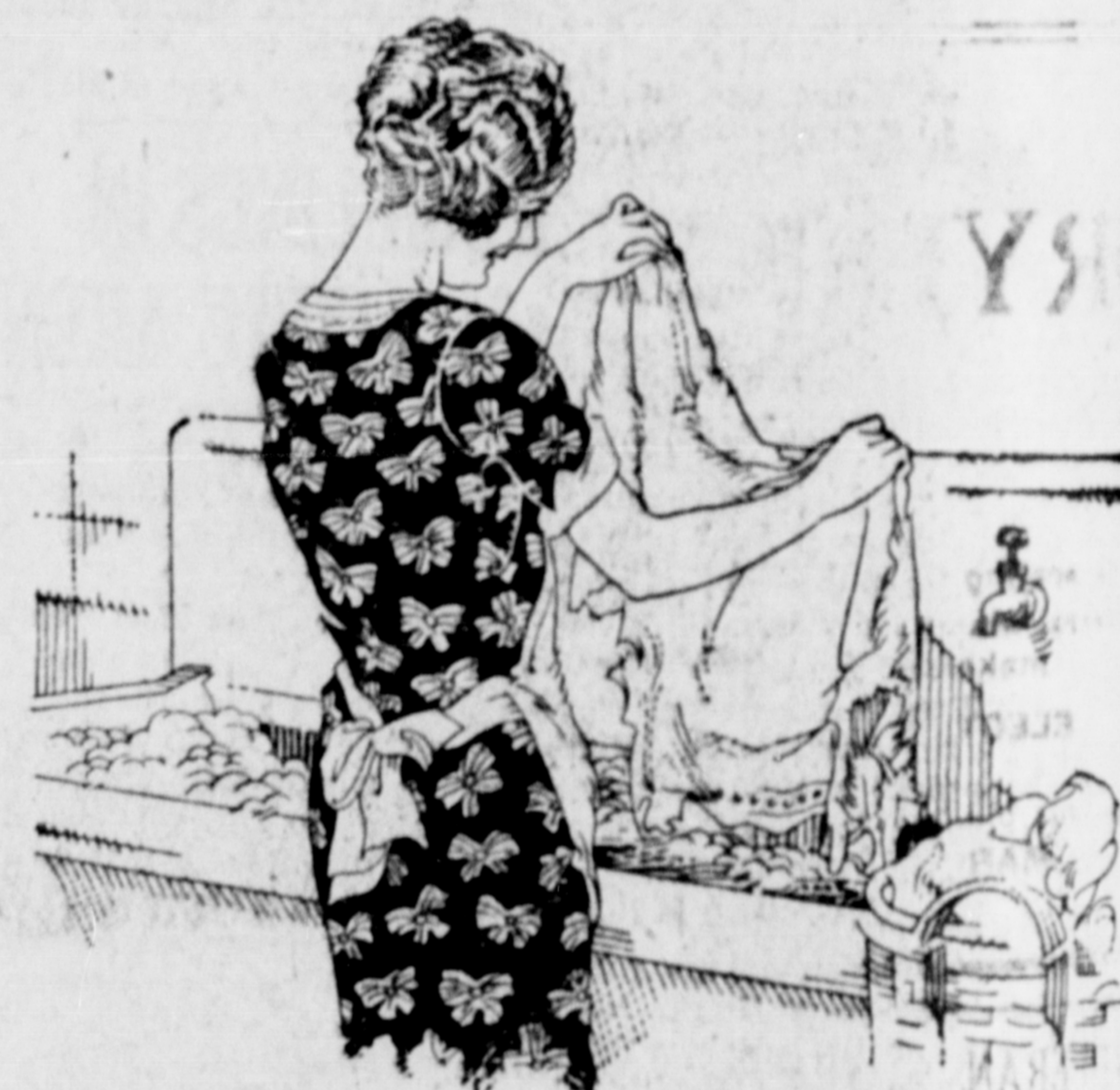
