

Russia Offers to Pay Pre-War Debts; Needs Help to Raise Money

LONDON, May 21 .- At an Anglo-Soviet conference yesterday, the Russian government offered to set aside a lump sum to cover pre-war debts to British subjects providing a loan could be arranged with the assistance of the British government. Only the claims of those who held Russian bonds prior to March 17, 1917, would, however, be considered.

The British delegation replied that it would not undertake to guarantee such a loan but it would take a sympathetic attitude towards the efforts of the Russians to raise a loan privately.
