

VANCOUVER, July 21.—One man is dead and the assistant general manager of the Pacific Great Eastern Railway, Robert Wilson, is in hospital as a result of a terrific battle this morning between the railway official and E. G. Cordingly, formerly accountant on the P.G.E. who was discharged two weeks ago following alleged irregularities in his work. The dead man is Cordingly. He followed Wilson into his office in the Vancouver Block and jumped at him, striking him on the head with the butt end of a heavy revolver.

Wilson ran through the man-ager's office into the corridor. 170,400 LBS. Cordingly fired at him and missed, but when Wilson fell after the second shot had grazed him, Cordingly jumped on him and started to beat his head with a
