## OTTAWA LADY TAMED A WILD HUMMINGBIRD

OTTAWA, Dec. 12.—To be one  
of the two women in ornithol-  
ogy's history who have tamed  
that elusive and somewhat rare  
American bird, the humming-  
bird, is the distinction held by  
Mrs. R. A. Brown, of Ottawa,  
who for the last two months  
has been the possessor of a  
beautiful specimen of this bril-  
liantly colored bird, which came  
to her of its own free will.

The fact that this delicate lit-  
tle creature has lived in captiv-  
ity for over two months is con-  
sidered most unusual. Members  
of the Dominion Government  
Parks Department have visited  
Mrs. Brown and taken motion  
pictures of the bird, which Mrs.  
Brown says "is no longer than  
my thumb." The story of how  
the little flyer first came to her  
through an open window, has  
been broadcasted. It is thought  
it delayed going south until too  
late and was attracted through  
the window by the warmth of the  
house. It lives almost entirely  
on insects.
