

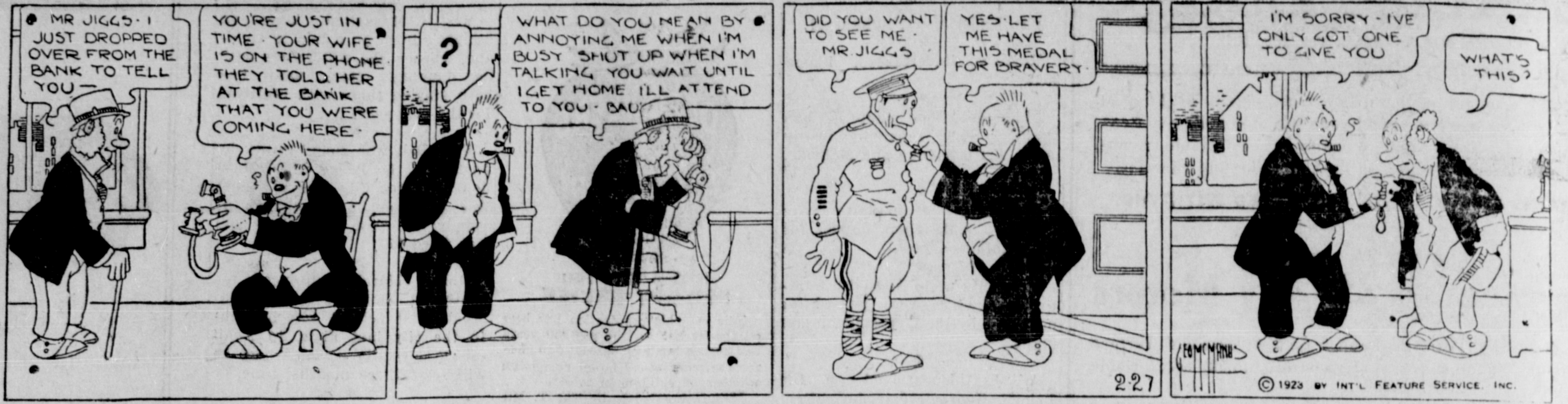

## BASEBALL RUN ON ECONOMICAL BASIS

Average Collections Amount to \$1.70 For Each Game Which Covers Expenses

BLOOMSBURG, Pa., Aug. 12.—A baseball league on a firm financial footing, despite the fact no direct admission is charged for the games, is flourishing here with but "one fly in the ointment." The "fly" happens to be the purloiner of balls knocked out of the park. Recently several motorists were seen to stop their cars, chase the ball and hasten away without returning them. The league is an inter-city organization with four teams, and the collections taken more than pay expenses, which amount to \$1.70 for each game. One dollar is paid the umpire; each of two boys who chase balls knocked out of the field get 25, and 10 cents each is given the water boy and the score-keeper.
