## GOVERNMENT RADIO PLANT GOING NORTH

Towers and Apparatus Passing Through Edmonton for McMurray

EDMONTON, Feb. 2. — The towers and apparatus necessary to the erection of the first of the chain of wireless stations which will span the huge distances of the north, are on their way to Edmonton from the east. The steel framework, electric generator, engine and other component parts of the unit, are on their way here, billed through to McMurray, and occupying an entire railway car.

This marks the commencement of the federal government's scheme to link up the north with wireless sending and receiving stations. In addition to McMurray, other stations will be placed at Fort Smith, Fort Simpson, and Herschel Island, the two latter being linked up with Dawson City, Y.T.

## INDIAN REVOLT IN EAST IS QUELLED

Six Nations Taken in Tow by Mounted Police Near Ottawa

WINNIPEG, Feb. 2.—A special despatch to the Free Press from Ottawa says: For three days the Six Nations Indians in the Gatineau hills, north of Ottawa, have been in open revolt. The insurrection has been suppressed by a detachment of Royal Canadian Mounted Police, 40 strong, who have arrested the Indian chiefs, Bras Coupe, Frank Wabi and Etienne Chabot.

The rising of the red men came as a result of a nationalist agitation, and was grounded upon the failure of the Six Nations leaders to obtain recognition as a separate nation within the British Empire from the League of Nations and the Canadian and Imperial governments.

## ALASKA TAGGED FISH CAUGHT IN FAR EAST

Marked on This Coast It Found Its Way to Vladivostok

KETCHIKAN, Feb. 2.—The following letter was recently received by the Bureau of Fisheries from their Far Eastern Bureau with headquarters at Vladivostok; it was dated October 28:

"On August 18 of this year, in the river Pankara in the district of Karagin, on the eastern shores of the peninsula of Kamchatka, a fish with the mark of 'U.S.B.F. No. 10358' was caught." The local residents did not pay any attention to this mark and the fish was cleaned and salted, and in this form it was discovered by the agents of the Far Eastern Fishery Board at Vladivostok. The length of the fish is 59 centimeters.

This fish is believed to be one of 10,000 salmon tagged by the bureau south of the Alaska Peninsula during the last season. It is believed that it was tagged on July 4 (1923), off the north shore of Enga Island.

## ALASKAN TRADE IS INCREASING STEADILY

For Year 1923 it is Expected to Reach Substantial Sum of \$95,000,000

JUNEAU, Feb. 2. — Alaskan trade during the calendar year of 1923 amounted, in round figures, to \$95,000,000, according to preliminary estimates of J. C. McBride, collector of customs for the territory. Mr. McBride is now engaged in the preparation of his annual report for last year and final and complete figures will not be available until early next month.

The estimate total exceeds the Territory's 1922 trade by between \$9,000,000 and \$10,000,000, indicating a growth in business of approximately 11 per cent. Increases in both exports and imports are estimated. Alaskan products exported last year are estimated to have a valuation of approximately \$30,000,000. Figures for the first ten months of the year show virtually \$29,000,000 in exports. It is estimated that the total exports for the year will be around \$35,000,000.
