Gobs Of Bunk By Politicians.

Samuel Crowther writes an illuminating article in the January Cosmopolitan in which he interprets Mussolini in a way we can understand him. He is described there as a new kind of politician who does not give a hang about political theories. Crowther says of him: "He has the political acumen to know that a politician cannot stay in power unless every so often he delivers himself of gobs of bunk but he makes short shrift of people' who talk bunk without knowing that it is bunk."

According to the same authority Mussolini is "notably deficient in illusions." He says: "Political philosophy must give way to political facts. I have not even the fetish of liberty when it is against the interest of the nation. Liberty is not only a right but also a duty. When liberty is not recognized also as a duty, then it is a duty to interfere with it. I shall proclaim reaction i I like-for me the terms of politics are but phrases."

Neither Demigod Nor Despot.

Speaking further of the man, Crowther says: Mussolini is those eastward from prairie neither a demigod nor a hired despot. He has done but a fraction of the things he is glorified or damned for. Aim Of Facism

According To Mussolini. According to Mussolini the aims of Facisism, the movement which he heads is a beneficent one. He says: "Our aim is reality. The proletariat has powers and qualities which must be defended and encouraged and it is also necessary that the bourgeoisie, in whose hands is the directive power in business should be able to continue its work in tranquility. Communism is grotesque and only worthy of uncivilized tribes. It is absurd to want to divide what has not been produced, to socialize misery and to advocate communism in a country of individualistic citizens. Lenin now admits the impotence of his own teaching and Russia is being transformed into a country of small middle class people. The experiment has failed and now the rapacions vultures of capitalism are descending in flocks upon the unfortunate land."

Trouble Caused By Sincere Fools.

Analyzing the situation Crowther gives vent to a truism which applies everywhere. He says "most of the trouble in the world is caused by the perfectly sincere fools." Mussolini was just as sincere when he was ranting in favor of socialism and publishing a paper advocating the cause as he was later when leading the party which now has control and which is opposed to any immediate socialistic efforts. At that time he was fanatic but now he believes in moderation. He refuses to take advantage of his victory to push his ideas forward. He realizes that, from extremes there is always reaction. It was the brutality of the Reds that brought on the revulsion in favor of Fascism.

Moderation Necessary In All Government.

Any policy of extremes in government of any kind is sure to bring about revulsion. The average elector knows little of the inevitable. causes and effects. He is not a student of politics and he judges largely from what other say. He is easily influenced. He makes the most foolish choices in picking men for governmental positions. He is liable to do practically anything. No one can tell how any election will turn out. A strong man, however usually catches the fancy of the people whether he be an extreme reformer or a reactionary of the most formidable type.

Edmonton Paper Urges That No Obstacles be Put in Way of Trade Westward

Hon, Dr. King, minister of public works, gave the Vancouver board of trade good advice when he said the aim should be to develop the port of Vancouver in conformity with national interests rather than to make it a immediate revenue-producer for the city or province. says the Edmonton Bulletin, editorially. In the same connection is the assurance given by the minister of marine and fisheries that the harbor board will not be allowed to enforce the proposed tenfold increase in the handling charges on grain until a thorough investigation has been made.

It is to be supposed that the minister of public works, himself crease in grain handling charges when he uttered the warning to the business men of the terminal city. In any case the advice may rell apply to that particular, as to the general policy of management of the port. The impression given by this attempted nine hundred per cent boost in the rates is that the harbor board thinks it has the prairie farmers at its mercy and can penalize them as it pleases for the benefit of the city or the province.

It will be a cardinal mistake if that notion is allowed to dominate the policy of the port authorities. Burrard Inlet is no better harbor now than it was twenty years ago. The railway grades from the prairie country are precisely what they were ten years ago. Railway rates have not been brought down to a parity with points.
