

Although the present price of logs is not very high, logging operations in the vicinity of Alice Arm continue to be active. Numerous small camps are running down the inlet, some of which having commenced last week. The camp of the Abbotsford Logging Co. is still operating.

Hans Peterson has left for Stewart where he will spend the winter.

B. C. D. Casey has arrived from Prince Rupert to relieve C. Warner of the Royal Bank staff who has gone on holidays.

STEWART

After a successful season of preliminary work including construction and actual mine development, the Rufus Silver-Led Mining Co. shut down work for the winter last week and the managing officials left for Seattle. It is planned to mine on a large scale next year. The Rufus property lies on the north side of Bear River about 18 miles from Stewart.

Development of the ore bodies on the B.C. Silver mine continues with satisfactory results. Recent shipment of 5 1/2 tons of dry ore gave smelter returns of 3.18 oz. gold and 68.1 oz. silver, a total value of \$810 per ton.

F. C. Winkler returned this week from Victoria where he organized a small company to explore and develop the White Heather group in the upper Salmon River valley. A contract for diamond drilling has been let to Boyle Bros. and work is ready in progress.

M. H. Slater and Miss Jeanette La Verne were married recently in Hyder and have left for Vancouver.

Another lead of good ore has been discovered on the Munro group on the west side of Salmon glacier and work will be carried on all winter by J. E. Munro and A. N. McDonald.
