ALICE ARM GETTING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

Railway Nearly Ready For Use—
Better Route to Wharf—
Thoroughfare Across Flats

ALICE ARM, July 9. — Great progress is being made with the summer's program of road work carried out by the government in the vicinity of Alice Arm.

The repairing of the Dolly Varden railway tracks is proceeding well and it is expected that it will be possible to operate hand cars before the end of the month to Camp 8. It is the only means of transportation up the Kitsault valley and its upkeep is of vital importance to the mining industry of the district.

Work has been going on for the past few weeks constructing a road from the new Kitsault bridge to connect up with the wharf road near the school. All that remains to be done to complete it is surfacing and, when this has been done, a first class road will be available from the wharf to the bridge.

Good progress is also being made on the road which will start at the east end of the Kitsault bridge, traverse the flats, and eventually connect up with the Illiance river pack trail across the bay. A considerable portion of this road has been cleared and graded and, as soon as logging operations are finished near the bridge, the work will be speeded up.

Eric Carlson, contractor for the Abbotsford Logging Co., is logging around 70,000 feet per day over the railroad. There is now over 3,000,000 feet boomed in the water awaiting the arrival of a tug to tow them to Ocean Falls. The No. 2 camp of the Granby Co. is sending down from 70,000 to 100,000 feet per day over the Dolly Varden railway. The logs are made up into small booms and towed to the company's sawmill at Larcom Island. The mill is cutting 75,000 feet per day and is in steady operation.


