# CHINESE GIRL NOT TO MARRY

### Eighteen Year Old High School Girl Wins Out in Rebellion Against Custom

PEKING, Feb. 14. — Miss Chiang Chin-yin, an 18-year-old high school girl who recently disputed the right acknowledged through thousands of generations of a parent to give his daughter's hand in marriage without her consent, has scored a noteworthy triumph. Not only has she converted her father and mother to her modern viewpoint, but her elder brother as well has renounced his right to a voice in the selection of his sister's life partner.

Miss Chiang made known her determination to defy parental authority by inserting an advertisement in various Chinese newspapers notifying everybody interested that she refused to recognize a betrothal agreement made by her elders with the father of young Hsiung Pao-chi. The parents have now resorted to the same means of acknowledging their acquiescence in the girl's rebellion and agreeing to cancellation of the contract.

The incident has aroused great interest among young Chinese maidens who are becoming rapidly modernized. The conservative older generation, however, thoroughly condemns the innovation as incompatible with the teachings of Confucius, and a threat to the ages-old authority of parents which must not be countenanced.

### Rev. Arthur Barner Delivers Interesting Address to Tuxis Boys of Methodist Church

The Tuxis Boys of the Methodist Church enjoyed a pancake supper last night in their new club rooms which were recently fitted up in the church.

After the supper, Rev. Arthur Barner, superintendent of Indian missions, addressed the boys taking as his subject: "Keep off the rocks." Mr. Barner, outlining reminiscences of his own life, drove home to his youthful hearers many valuable hints in the proper manner of conducting their lives. He told how at the age of 13 he had been placed in a brewers' office in Bristol. Beer was as free as water and, at the age of 22, he found himself up against the necessity of breaking away or becoming a drunkard. He chose the former course and took up the ministry. Mr. Barner then went on to trace his career up to the time of his appointment as superintendent of missions.

# SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

### PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre, east of the Coast Range and 3,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emption must be accepted for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

For more detailed information see the Bulletin "How to Pre-empt Land."

### PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 19, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stampage.

### HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 30 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

### LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

### GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
