Failure of U.S. Congress to Make Reductions Will Injure the Republicans

WASHINGTON, April 25,-(By Canadian Press .- Proposals for comprehensive revision of railroad laws which were numerous when the present session of the United States congress jopened will in all probability come to nothing.

The Senate Interstate Commerce Commission has decided to begin hearings on the differeat bills to change the rate-making provisions of the transportation Act, but as these hearings will not begin until more than four months of this session congress has passed, it is not expected that they will result in any action being taken.

Advocates of the changes in the railroad laws say that the Republican organization in both the House and the Senate is controlled by members who want to see the present Transportation act continued and that this organization has blocked any action on the revision proposals. Republicans, on the other hand, charge that Democratic advocates of railroad law revision are not sincere and that their advocacy is a political ruse.

It is apparent that there is not likely to be any comprehensive, revision of railroad laws until the new congress is elected and | that no downward revision rail rates in the United States. can be expected.

The political effect of the failere of Congress to deal with the railroad question and the question of freight rates, except in mild and ineffective way may be far-reaching. It is almost sure to increase the troubles of the Republicans in the agricultural states. The Republicans, being the party in power, will be held responsible for failure to lower freight rates. Feeling in the agricultural, states that the freights are excessive is extremely bitter.
