WOMAN RESCUED AT EDMONTON

Found in Precarious Position After Being Missing Mysteriously

EDMONTON, April 25.—The thrilling rescue of Mrs. P. F. Adamson by members of the fire and police department and several friends, from a precarious position on a concrete pier under the High Level bridge, 150 feet above the ice in the Saskatchewan river, came as a startling climax to a drama which has stirred the city of Edmonton since she disappeared mysteriously from in front of the Capitol Theatre.

The mystery which surrounded the woman's whereabouts was cleared, when Mrs. Adamson, feeling considerably better after her trying ordeal, told her story. When she wandered away from in front of the Capitol theatre, where she and her husband had a moment before come from a show, Mrs. Adamson, according to her story as told at the hospital, hurried down lanes and avenues to 105th street, down which she proceeded as far as Hardisty avenue. Crossing to 109th street, she reached the high level bridge, in some way climbed up on to the girders and walked along at a dizzy height above the river.

Cried for Help

Suicide, Mrs. Adamson admits, was in her mind, and for some time she contemplated this deed, always stopping, however, just short of actually making the attempt. Something, she couldn't explain what, held her from the deed. Finally all thoughts of suicide were banished from her mind, and Mrs. Adamson's one desire was to get back to safety. She found, however, she could not climb back to the top of the

bridge. With every footstep heard on the bridge above, the woman cried for help, but none heard.

All during Wednesday night, Thursday night and part of Friday, Mrs. Adamson said, she remained on the girders. Both nights she slept on a girder less than a foot wide, with barely room to lay down. Then she crawled along the girders, leaping eventually to reach the end of the bridge and to climb to safety. Her attempt was unsuccessful. Finally, she risked a drop of a full fifteen feet, and landed on a girder below. From that point she was able to reach the pillar on which she was at last found.

No Food or Drink

Four days and four nights Mrs. Adamson spent in her perilous position. Of food and drink she had none, and with biting winds playing around her place of refuge, existence became a question of vitality and endurance. Her greatest suffering, Mrs. Adamson said, was occasioned by lack of water. It snowed a little, and then she was able, she said, to get a drink. At other times, when her lips and mouth became so parched as to be a veritable agony, she would breathe upon the cold steel of the girder and lick off the moisture that gathered. In this way she was able to continue existence until finally rescued.

So far as the exposure was concerned, Mrs. Adamson suffered chiefly from a chilling of the feet and limbs. Her shoes were off, her stockings torn, and when picked up she was blue with the cold. On Monday, however, the woman was reported to be making rapid progress toward recovery.

FIFTY NEWSPAPERS HAVE DISAPPEARED

Mounting Cost of Publishing Causes Consolidation of Effort

OTTAWA, April 25.—Since the beginning of 1914 no less than fifty newspapers have disappeared in Canada, either by going out of business altogether or by amalgamating with others. Even in large cities like Winnipeg the third paper, the Telegram, had to disappear, and the latest example is seen at Vancouver where the World was recently taken over by the Sun, leaving only two papers there.

The recent withdrawal of the Government grant to the Canadian Press to aid in bridging the long gaps between settlements from coast to coast has considerably increased the burden

LONDON, April 25.—The infant daughter of Lady Louis Mountbatten, the richest baby in England, was christened in the chapel royal in St. James Palace this week. There was a small congregation of intimate friends at the ceremony, including the Prince of Wales who stood godfather to the child jointly with the Earl of Breeknock.

The baby was born on St. Valentine's day, her mother was formerly Edwina Ashley, who fell heir to the greater part of a fortune of \$30,000,000 from her grandfather, Sir Ernest Cassel. Lord Louis Mountbatten served as a midshipman on the Lion, Beatty's flagship during the war and was a companion of the Prince of Wales as naval aide on his trip around the world.
